### Leon E. Panetta



served in the appointed position of White House Chief of Staff from 1994 until 1997. He played a major role in the development of the President's economic plan, which resulted in a deficit reduction and produced a strong foundation for economic growth. He began his career in government as legislative assistant to Senator Thomas Kuchel of California. In 1976 he was elected a United States Representative from California's 16<sup>th</sup> (now 17<sup>th</sup>) district. During his tenure in Congress, Mr. Panetta was

chairman of several committees and subcommittees, as well as a key participant in all Budget Summits and author of the Hunger Prevention Act. He was an ally of Civil Rights, the environment, and terminally ill patients. After his government service he returned to California to practice law. Today, Mr. Panetta serves as a Distinguished Scholar to the Chancellor of the California State university system and as a professor at Santa Clara University and CSU Monterey Bay. Mr. Panetta is on the Board of Directors of several organizations, including the New York Stock

### Haley Barbour



is a former two-term chairman of the Republican National Committee (RNC). Under his leadership, Republicans won the greatest midterm majority sweep of the 20th century, winning GOP control of both houses of Congress for the first time in 40 years. Also during Mr. Barbour's tenure, the RNC broke all fundraising records, donated record-breaking amounts to GOP candidates, created an award-winning magazine, and built a TV studio that produces a weekly national news show. Mr. Barbour served as director of the White House Office of Political Affairs for President Ronald Reagan from 1995 to 1997. He recently joined the law firm of Barbour, Griffith & Rogers. He serves as deputy chairman of the International Democratic Union, founded by President Reagan and Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher, which strives to unite center-right, free enterprise, democratic political parties around the world. He is a member of the Board of Directors of the Mississippi Chemical Corporation and Blount International, Inc., an Alabama based diversified manufacturing company. In 1982 he was the Republican nominee from Mississippi for the U.S. Senate, losing to 35-year incumbent Senator John Stennis. He also served for two years as Republican National Committeeman for Mississippi.
