He's a crusader for health and human services. *The New York Times* once called him "the deputy president for human affairs." He's a lawyer, an author, and an insider who worked alongside three presidents – Kennedy, Johnson and Carter.

Joseph Califano, Jr. is America's last Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare and is one of only two living secretaries of HEW. He served under President John F. Kennedy, under President Lyndon B. Johnson and under President Jimmy Carter. He was general counsel to the U.S. Army and a special assistant to the U.S. Secretary of Defense.

In these roles, he is known for supporting childhood immunizations, pursuing a staunch national anti-smoking campaign, issuing Title IX regulations to provide equal opportunity for women in college athletics as well as regulations to provide equal access to the handicapped. He is now finishing a 12th book, *Parent Power: The Key to Raising Drug-Free Kids*, to be published this fall.

He will speak **Wednesday, April 1 at 10:20 a.m. in Parlors B&C of the MSU Union, Grand River at Abbott Road on the MSU campus.** His speech title mirrors that of his autobiography *Inside: A Public and Private Life*, a memoir that critics acclaim as America's "most revealing."

There's no charge to attend the lecture by this national leader during a historymaking era in America.
