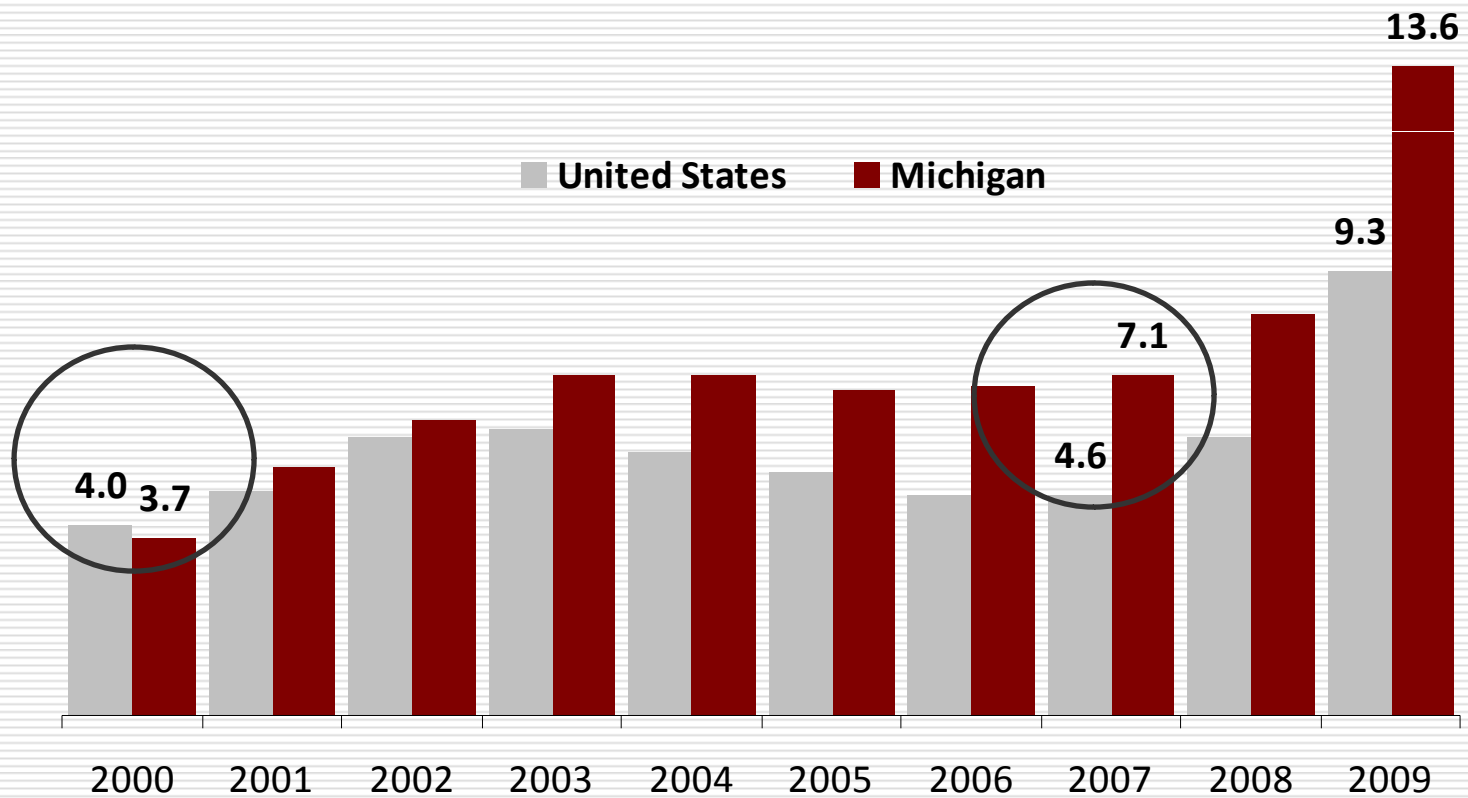

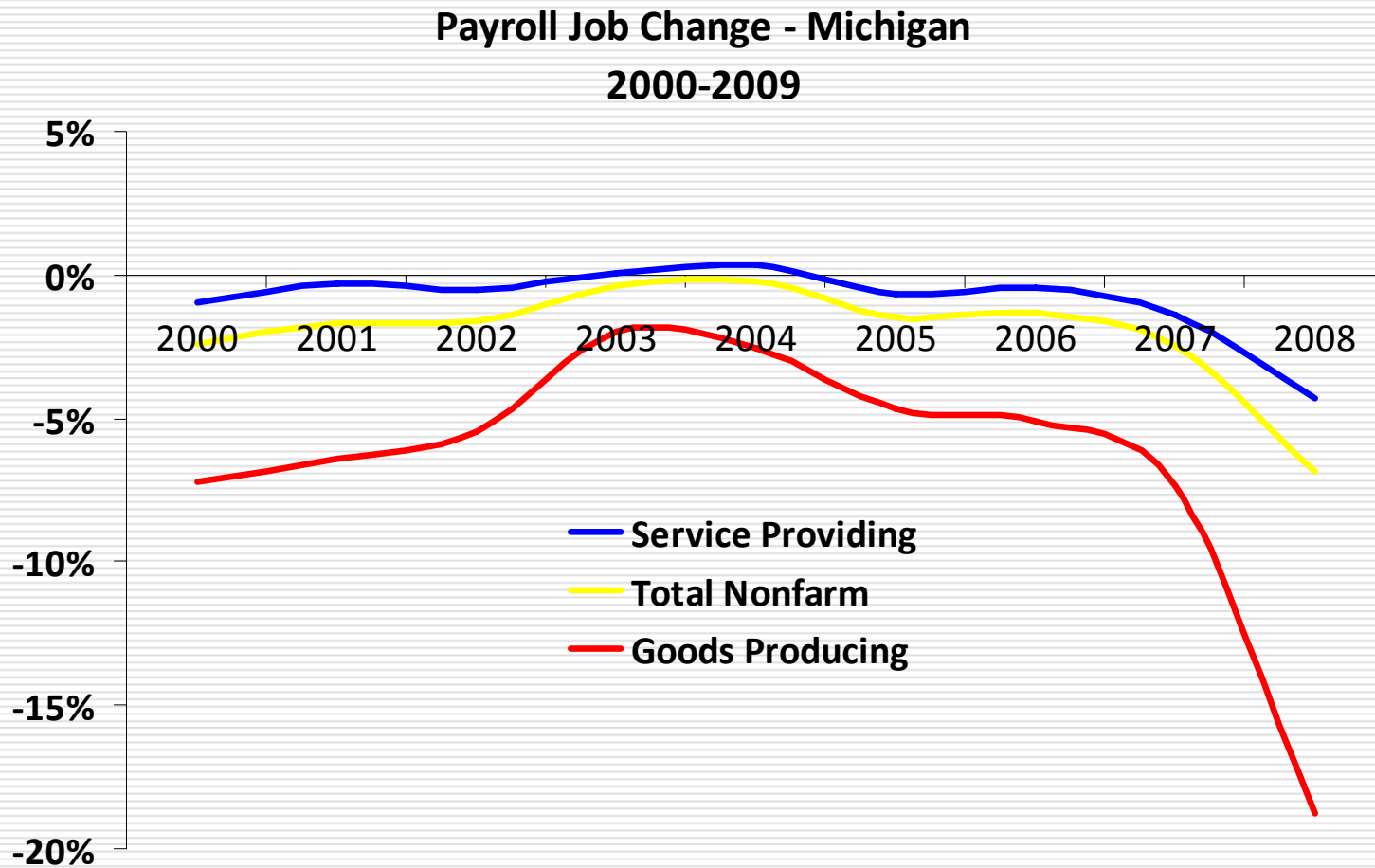
Michigan's Jobless Rate Tripled Since 2000 – Reflecting Major Economic Restructuring

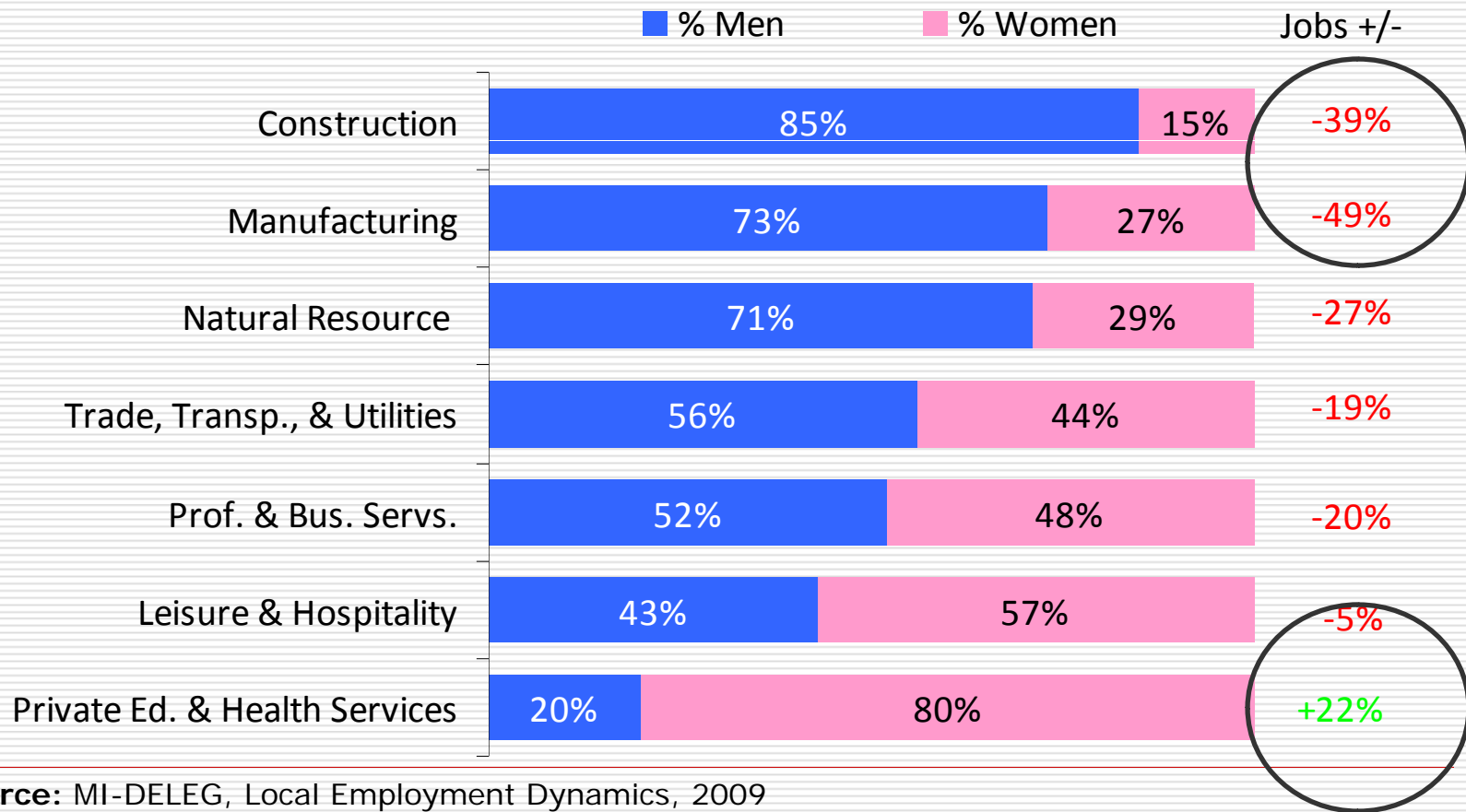
Since 2000, Michigan's Goods-Producing Sectors Have Lost Half a Million Jobs

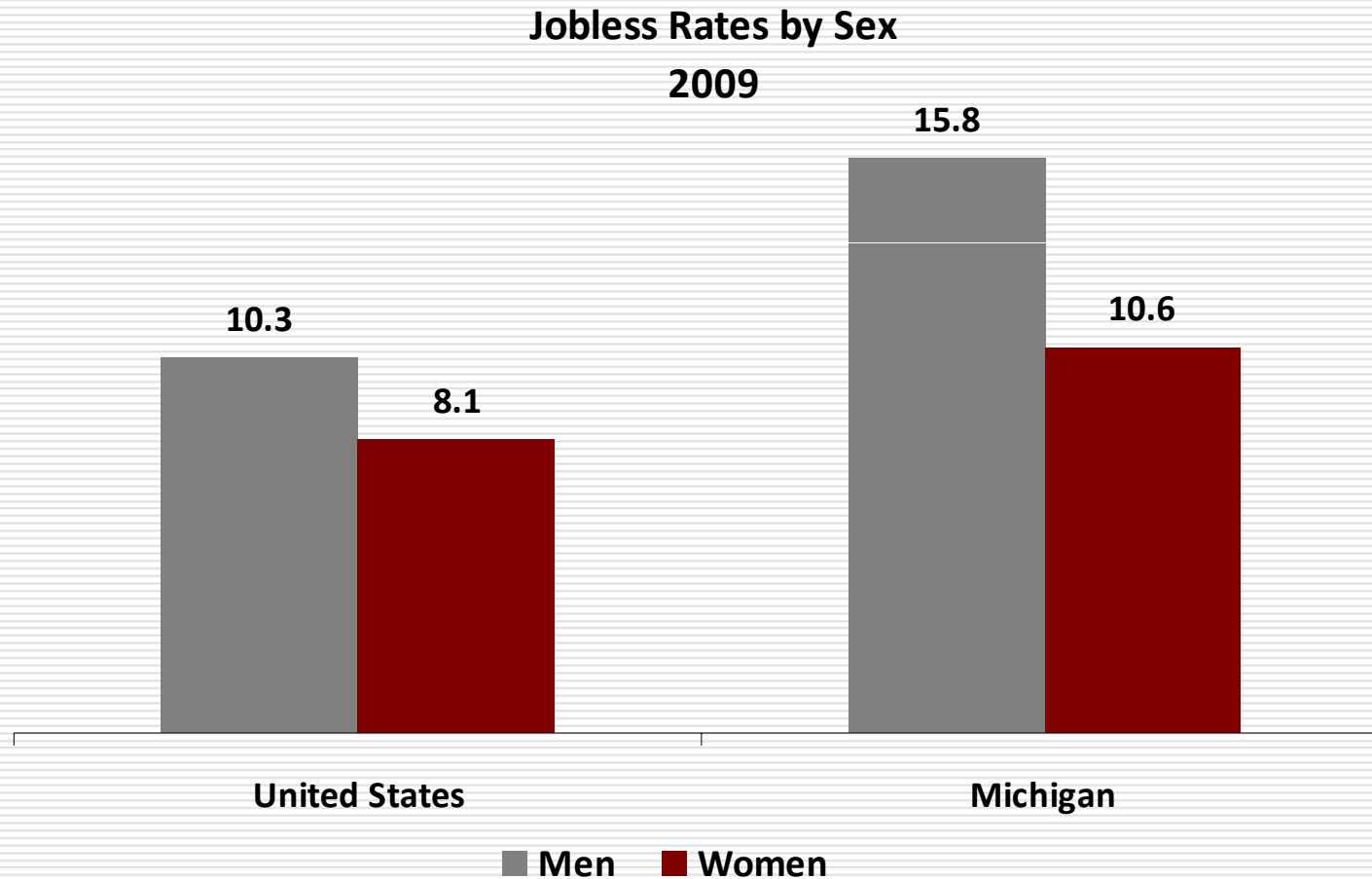
Michigan's Job Losses Concentrated in Male-Dominated Industries

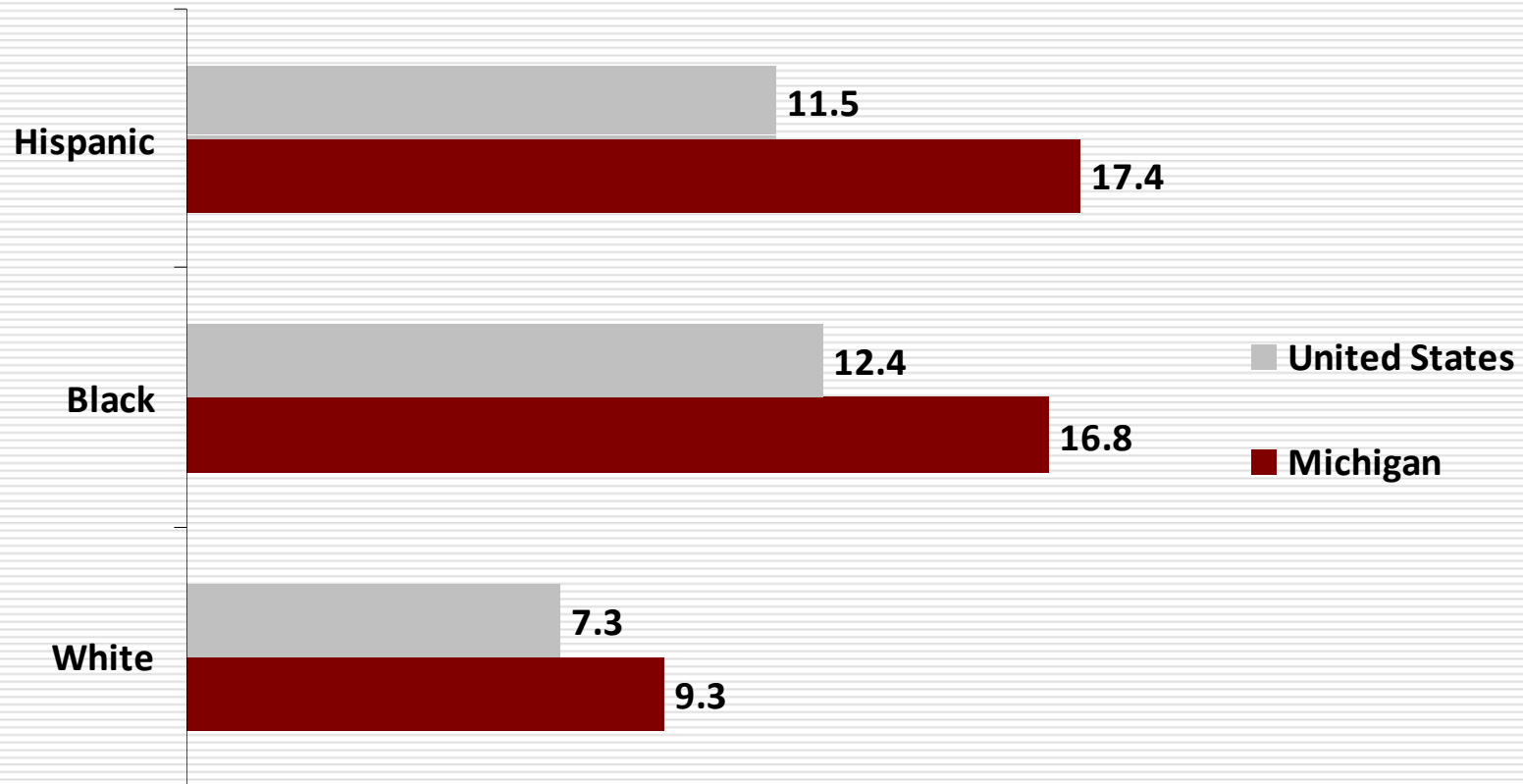
Unemployment Rate for Michigan Women Measures 10.6 Percent

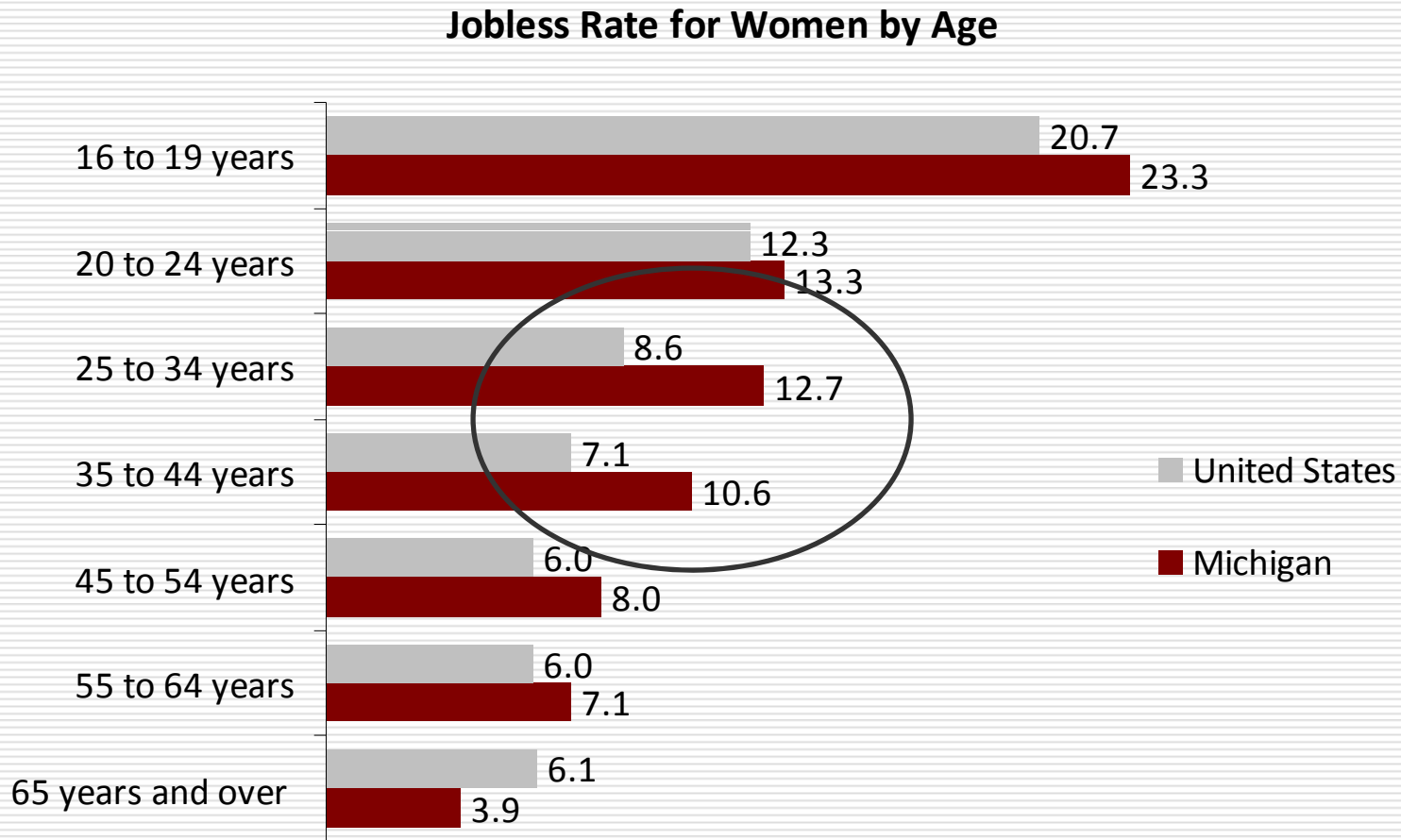
Michigan's Minority Women Face Higher Jobless Rates Compared to National Peers

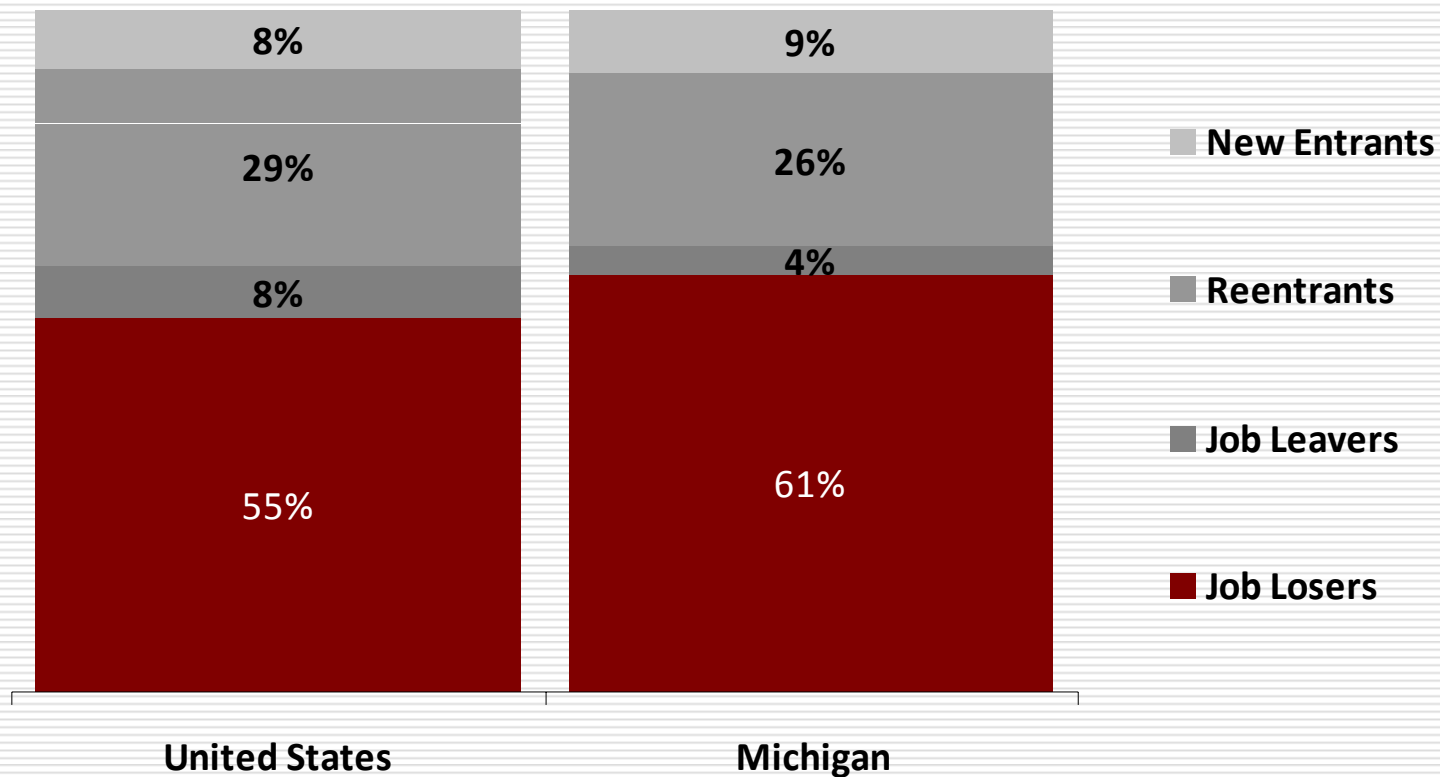
Michigan's Young Women Have The Largest Jobless Rate Gap Compared to U.S. Women

Sixty-One Percent of Unemployed Women in Michigan Lost Their Job

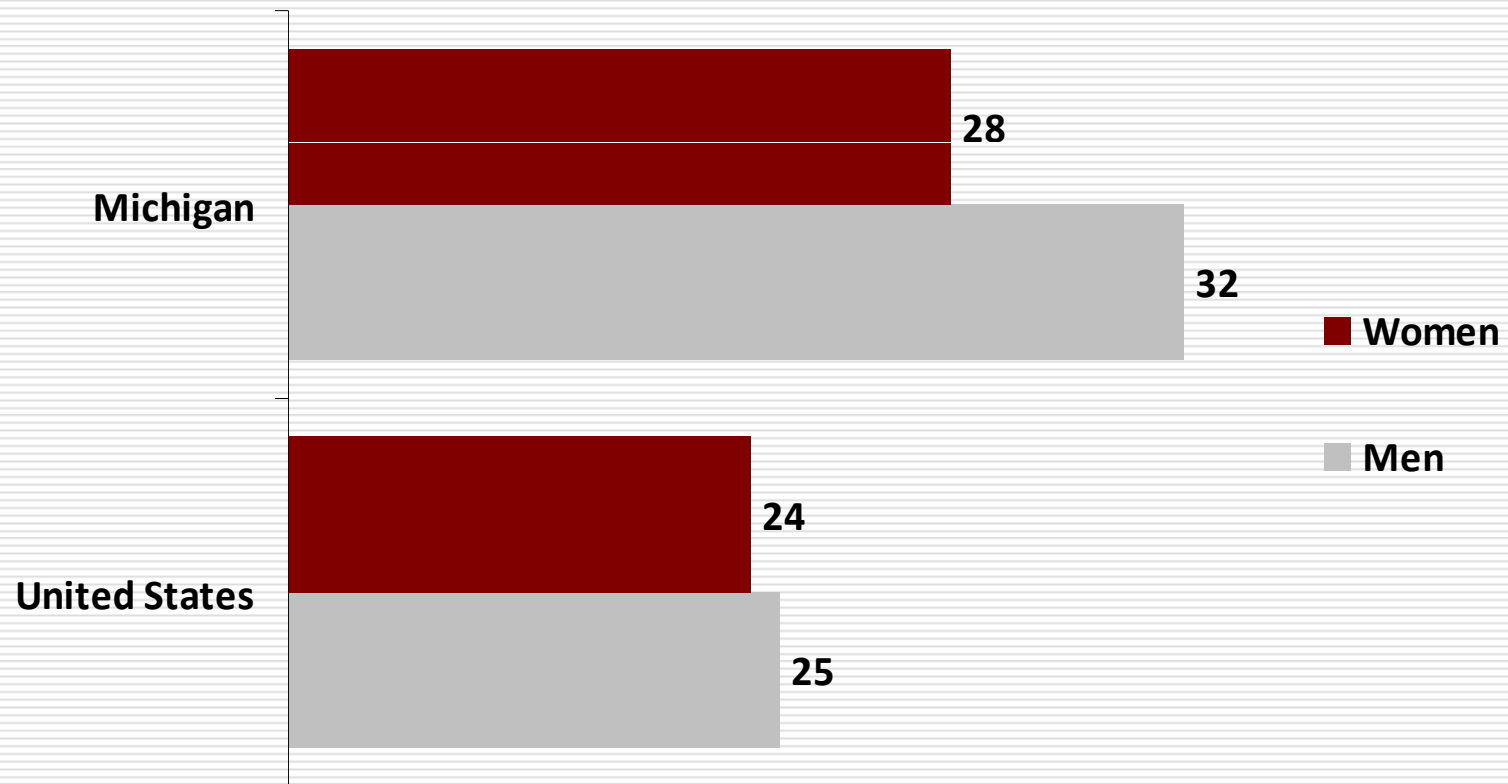
Jobless Women by Category

On Average, Michigan Women Are Out of Work Four Weeks Longer than U.S. Women

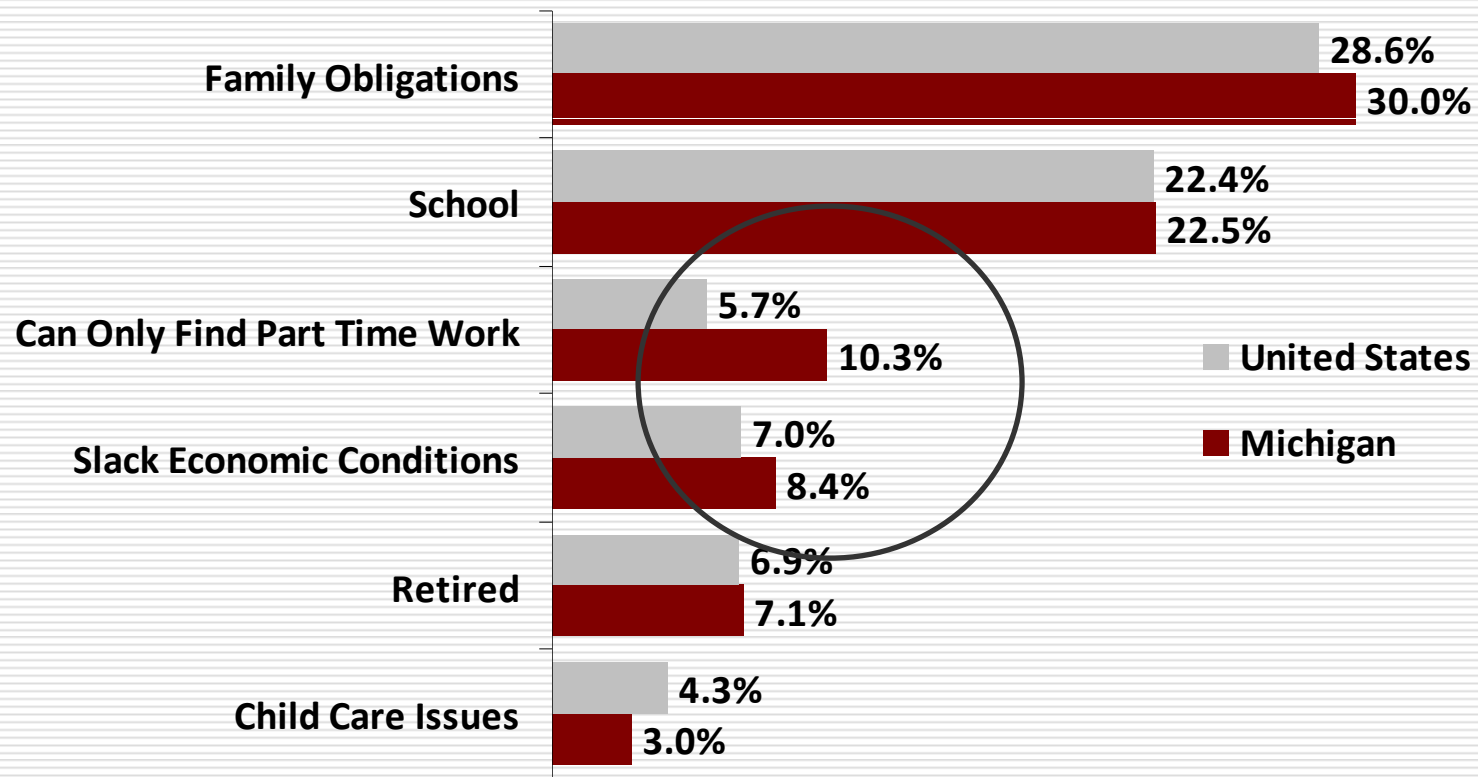
Average Duration of Unemployment (Weeks)

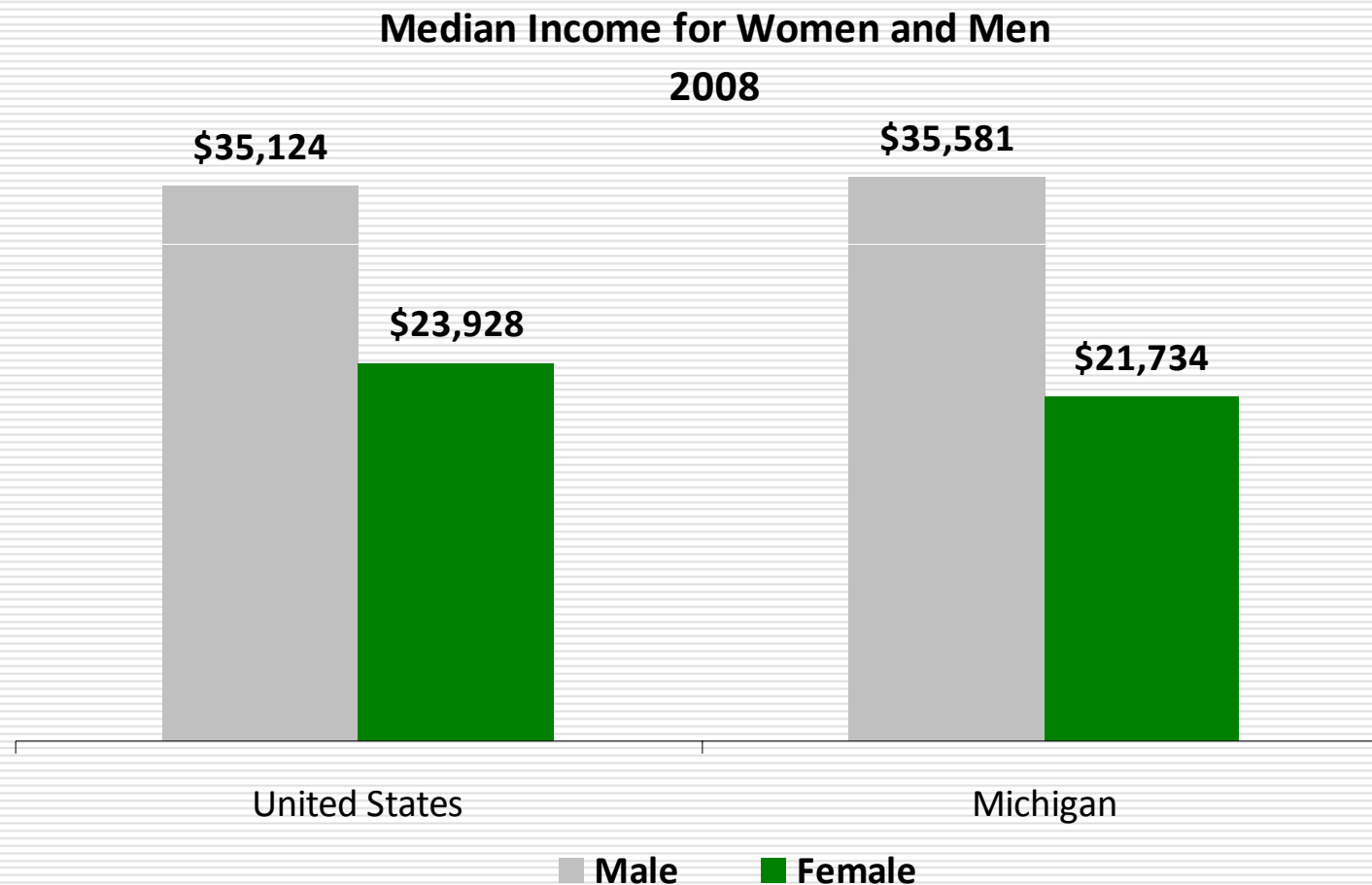
Economic Conditions Are Responsible for Many Michigan Women Working Part-Time
