Ratings inch upward for Trump, downward for Snyder.





**President Trump's favorable** ratings continued to edge upward. He received ratings of "excellent" or "good" from 34.4% of Michigan residents. That compares with 31.5% in the previous survey.




## These are the most favorable ratings ever for Trump.

Despite the improvement, however, Trump's ratings remained lower than Clinton or Obama ever received, but higher than George W. Bush received in his second term.




Governor Snyder's favorable ratings dipped slightly, with 28.5% giving him a rating of "excellent" or "good."




Former Governors Engler and Granholm had their lowest ratings in the last round of State of the State Survey before they left office.

Governor Snyder has avoided that fate. His last set of ratings are well below his best, but also not his worst.








# President Trump evokes more extreme responses than Governor Snyder:

Trump has a higher percentage of "excellent" ratings, but also a higher percentage of "poor" ratings.



When we look beneath the statewide averages, the ratings for Trump and Snyder reveal stark differences in attitudes, by race, sex, party affiliation, and region.



The fraction of Michigan residents who say their current financial situation is "excellent" or "good" dropped a bit, but remained strong by historical standards.


Assessments of the current financial situation remained slightly below the all-time highs, set in the late 1990s and early 2000s.


When asked whether they are better off than one year ago, Michigan residents gave ratings that were among the best of this century.





Michigan residents' assessment of whether they will be better off one year from now was also one of the best in more than a decade.





For all three of these measures of consumer confidence, the ratings are much better than in 2006-2011, but still lower than in 1999.
