



### Michigan Residents' Ratings of Governor Snyder's Performance, Fall 2011




Percentage of Michigan Residents Rating Performance of Governors as "Excellent" or "Good," 1995-2011






### Michigan Residents' Ratings of President Obama's Performance, Fall 2011








## The U.S. Congress received very poor performance ratings.

### Michigan Residents' Ratings of the Performance of the U.S. Congress, Fall 2011




## After a long period of improvement, consumer confidence has declined in the last two surveys.

### In Winter 2011, assessments of the current financial situation were at their highest level since 2007.


## But they have fallen back a bit in the last two surveys.






In Winter 2011, when asked whether they were better off or worse off than one year before, Michigan residents gave the highest ratings since 2006.

But these ratings also have fallen in the last two surveys.









In Winter 2011, when asked whether they expect to be better off or worse off in one year, Michigan residents gave the highest ratings since 2004.
