




President Obama's positive ratings remained about the same as before.










Consumer confidence had slipped in the last two surveys of 2011, but it rose sharply in the first survey of 2012.


In Winter-Spring 2012, assessments of the current financial situation were at their highest level since 2005.







In Winter-Spring 2012, when asked whether they were better off or worse off than one year before, Michigan residents gave the highest ratings since 2005.





In Winter-Spring 2012, when asked whether they expect to be better off or worse off in one year, Michigan residents gave the highest ratings since 2004.













Trust in Federal Government Reaches All-Time Low


Michigan Residents' Opinions of How Often They Can Trust Different Levels of Government, Winter-Spring 2012
